An Ordinance providing for the vacation of parts of Maple Avenue,

Lincoln Street, and Wilson Street in the Incorporated Town of

Conrad, and further providing for the conveyance of the parts

Of streets and avenues thus vacated.

See - Whereas Blocks one, two, and three of Clark's Addition to the  
Incorporated Town of Conrad have been acquired by the Consolidated  
Independent School District of Conrad for School purposes and  
Whereas the public intrest requites that the parts of Lincoln and  
Wilson streets situated between said blocks and that part of Maple A  
Avenue adjacent to Block's two and three of said addition become a  
Part of said school tract,

See - Therefore be it ordained by the Town Council of the Incorporated  
Town of Conrad that the portion of Lincoln Street described as follows,  
Beginning at the south-east corner of Block One of Clark's addition  
To the, Town of Conrad, running thence north along the line of  
Lincoln street three hundred sixty (360) feet, to the north- east  
Corner of the said Block one, thence East Fifty (50) feet, thence  
South along the west line of Block One, of said Addition three hundred  
Sixty feet to the south west corner of said Block two, thence west  
Fifty (50) feet to the place of beginning; also that portion of Wilson  
Street described as follows, - Contuned to page 145.

Approved and passed this 14<sup>th</sup> day of May 1923.

**RESOLUTION OF NECESSITY**

Be it resolved by the Town Council of the Incorporated Town of Conrad Iowa. on its own motion: that it is deemed advisable and necessary for proper sanitary regulation and for the preservation of the public health of the inhabitants of said town to build, construct and put in place lines of sanitary sewer in said town, as follows; An 8 inch sewer commencing at the intersection of Alice and Center Streets in said town and running thence east along the center line of said Center Street approximately 370 ft, to the center line of Lincoln Street, thence north on the center line of Lincoln Street approximately 430 ft, to the center line of Grundy Avenue. Allsaid sewers to be constructed of No, 1 salt glazed vitrified clay Sewer pipe of the best quality of the internal diameter of 8 inches over,

146 said sewer to be provided with all necessary, junctions and appurtenances as may be necessary.

Said sewer to be constructed in strict accordance with the plans and specifications there for, to be prepared by E A Crary, Civil Engineer, and approved by the Town Council and the state Board of Health, That the cost and expenses of making and constructing said sanitary sewers, including the expenses of such sewers or parts thereof which come on or across street or alley intersections, and those places opposite streets and alleys intersecting but not crossings, and also including all other ~~these~~ ~~of expense~~ manholes, Y, junctions, lampholes and other appurtenances, and also including all other items of expense incurred on the part of said town by reason of the construction of said sewers which under the laws of the State of Iowa are assessable, shall be assessed against the property abutting upon the same and the owners thereof, in accordance with the laws of the State of Iowa governing the same.

All assessments are to be made in accordance and in proportion to the benefits conferred upon each lot or parcel of ground. any discrepancy between the cost of the sewer and the amount which can be legally assessed against said abutting property shall be paid out of any funds of the town available by law for such purpose.

Be it further resolved, that the above and foregoing improvement are hereby proposed to be made and constructed as here in before set forth, and that this proposed resolution, except this paragraph, be and same is hereby set down for further and final hearing, consideration and determination, at a meeting of the Town Council to be held on the 19<sup>th</sup> day of June, 1923. at ~~8~~ 8 o'clock P M. in the council chamber in said Town. and that the Town Clerk be and he is hereby instructed to cause notice of the pendency of the above resolution, and time and place when and where said proposed resolution will be considered for passage, and objections to the passage thereof and to the construction of said proposed improvements heard, to be given by publication in the Conrad Record, a newspaper of general circulation in the town of Conrad, Iowa, in the manner and for the time provided by law.

The above resolution was approved and ordered placed on file for final action, and notice of the pendency thereof ordered given, this 4th day of June 1923.
