Lutes commented that the IE bill for \$350. was for the rebuilding of the Christmas light circuits. The total paid for the Christmas decorations was \$1404. with \$1293. in donations from the community, leaving a balance of \$461. as the city's share in the project. Then there was a motion by Lutes and second by Graham that the above bills be accepted and warrants drawn on the same. Carried.

Being 7:30 P.M. the time advertised for the Public Budget and Federal Revenue Sharing Hearings the meeting was adjourned with a motion by Moler, second by Zern. Carried.

The Public Hearing on the proposed budget for FY 81 & 82 was called to order by Mayor Schleisman. There was a motion by Lutes that \$8000. allocated for the street fund be transferred; \$5000. to police protection and \$3000. to fire protection. Second by Moler. Motion carried. As there were no other comments the hearing was adjourned with a motion by Moler, second by Zern. Carried.

The Public Hearing for the allocation of \$11,452. in Federal Revenue Sharing funds was then called to order by Mayor Schleisman. There were no comments from the public. The \$11,452. in FRS funds has been designated for community protection and the council discussed the possibility of using some of these funds to purchase a new police car. Graham made a motion to adjourn the hearing, second by Beeghly. Carried.

The council meeting was again called to order by Mayor Schleisman. Roll call of councilmen present: Zern, Moler, Lutes, Graham & Beeghly.

Discussed next was the change in Sections 2 & 3 of ordinance #142 to raise the water and sewer rates. Don Kliebenstein was asked to rewrite these sections of the ordinance incorporating the rates as stated in the February 9th minutes. There was a motion by Graham, second by Lutes that these changes, as ordinance #148, take effect on April 1, 1981.

Next there was a motion by Beeghly, second by Zern to move from the first to the third reading.

Motion carried.

At this time there was a motion to adjourn the business meeting by Moler, second by Zern. Carried.

The budget hearing was again called to order by Mayor Schleisman. It was noted that the debt service asking was \$65,642. instead of \$63,070. because of an error in figuring the interest. There was a motion by Beeghly to certify the budget to the county auditor. Second by Lutes.

Motion carried. There was a motion to adjourn the hearing by Zern, second by Graham. Carried. *Mayor Schleisman called the business meeting to order at this time.*
Roll call vote of councilmen present: Zern, Moler, Lutes, Graham & Beeghly.

A Class C liquor license was granted to the Corral in a motion by Lutes, second by Zern. Carried.

The seven acres designated for parks in the Blythe sub-division was discussed, with the general feeling that the parks be left as green belt areas. Also discussed was the park east of the Methodist Church. The possibility of selling lots was again discussed and also the north end being used for a new water tower sometime in the future.

Mayor Schleisman reported that the application for a permit to flouridate

the city's water has been made. If the federal funding is made available it will cover all costs of flouridating and ~~two~~^{one} years supply of flouride free of charge.

Bob Klein, of Conrad Independent Insurance was present to explain that a "package deal" of the city's liability, auto & fire insurance could possibly save the city 10% in overall costs. Klein will have two insurance companies prepare a "package deal" and present these proposals to the council at a later date.

There was a motion by Beeghly, second by Lutes to have Hugh Copeland of INRCOG go ahead on the proposal to update Conrad's planning and zoning book. The project will cost the city \$2500. if matching funds from HUD are available, and if no funds are available the project can be dropped at no cost. Motion carried.

A light on an existing pole at the rear of Casey's General Store was discussed as a safety factor. The clerk checked with Mr. Utterbach of IE and he felt the maximum charge would be \$5.50 a month. Bob Kruse was to visit with the owner of Casey's and the laundromat and see if they would be interested in splitting that cost.

It was felt that a street light at the west end of the drive in the park and one at the alley on Boyd Street between Main and Washington would be beneficial. Beeghly will check on this and report at the next regular meeting.

It was noted that the work on renovating the pool has begun with the concrete already being broken up. The Mayor and councilmen each agreed to donate \$100. toward this fund.

Beeghly asked each council member to check the old dumping site by the next meeting to see if they thought the dumping of concrete should still be allowed there.

Motion to adjourn by Moler, second by Beeghly. Motion carried. 9:45 P.M.
