

SPECIAL MEETING  
May 21, 1979

A special meeting was called to order in the Council Chambers by Mayor Schleisman at 7:30 p.m. for the purpose of holding a Public Hearing on the proposed sewer facility plan.

Councilmen present: Vane Graham, Gary Moler, Phil McLean, & Ron Beeghly.  
Absent: Bob Zern.

Others Present: Mr. & Mrs. Dave Fox, John McNair, Dale Smith, Jay Hurlbutt, Stan Miller, Mrs. Don Martin, Mr. & Mrs. Jack Eflin, and Mrs. Glenn Hurlbutt.

At 7:30 p.m. Mayor Schleisman opened the Public Hearing under the direction of Dave Fox. Fox explained the history of the proposed sewer utility and gave reasons for the need of a new plant, mainly consisting of IDEQ directives. Maps of the proposed site on the Jack Eflin property were shown with tentative placement of a 3-cell lagoon. Fox estimated that the cost, if constructed today, would be approximately \$1.4 Million, but he also stated that it would be at least 2-3 years before construction would be started and the cost would probably be higher by then. The reason for the holdup in construction is due to all the necessary paper work to be done and approved by the state agencies. One highlight was that the Federal and State governments would be funding roughly 80% of the total project.

Questions were asked Fox about various aspects of the project such as location, water contaminants, leakage, flood plain, maximum population size, and projected life expectancy of the system. In essence, he stated that all of these items had been considered and that with these and the cost of other types of plants that the 3-cell lagoon system would be the most cost-efficient.

At 8:25 p.m., there being no more discussion directed towards the Facility Plan, Mayor Schleisman declared the Public Hearing adjourned.

Smith Construction is to be in town in the near future to repair major street problems, but meanwhile, Miller is to get a load of patching cold mix to fill in some minor holes in various areas.

Beeghly stated that the S. Main street bridge should again be painted, possibly by a local group or club. This is to be looked into.

The clerk had been directed by Graham to look into the legality of funding a new fire station through a financial institution. It was reported that this route was not to be taken, but that bonds should be issued. A cost figure on the new building is to be obtained and then given to the city attorney for action.

Motion by Graham, second by Beeghly, to adjourn. Carried. 9:27 p.m.
