The Council met in Special Session at the Town Hall at the call of Mayor John R. Gier.

On being called to order at 7:00 P.M. the following members were present: Mayor Gier and Councilmen Brockway, Gravenstein, Hesselhuus, and Newton.

Absent: Councilman Crouse.

The Clerk then presented the following petition signed by 40 resident free-holders of the Town of Conrad:

"Conrad, Iowa, April 18, 1938. To the Town Council of the Town of Conrad, Grundy County, Iowa:

We, the undersigned resident free-holders of the said Town of Conrad hereby petition you to submit to the legal voters of said Town the public question: 'Shall the Town of Conrad erect and equip a Community Hall, or Community Center, within the corporate limits of said Town and to issue the negotiable bonds of said Town in the sum not to exceed the sum of \$12,000.00 and to levy a tax each year for the purpose of liquidating said bonds as provided by law.'"

The Clerk then presented the following

RESOLUTION.

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE INCORPORATED TOWN OF CONRAD, GRUNDY COUNTY, IOWA, that at a special municipal election of said Town to be held Monday, May 23rd, 1938, there be submitted to the legal voters of said Town the following Public Question, a petition for such proceeding sufficient in form and number having been filed:

"Shall the Incorporated Town of Conrad erect and equip a Community Hall, or Community Center House, within the corporate limits of said Town and contract indebtedness for such purpose not exceeding \$12,000.00 and issue bonds for such purpose not exceeding \$12,000.00 and levy tax annually upon the taxable property in said Town of Conrad, not exceeding $3\frac{1}{4}$ mills per annum for the payment of such bonds and the interest thereon?"

Moved by Newton and seconded by Hesselhuus that the above Resolution be adopted. On the roll being called the following vote resulted: Brockway, Aye; Gravenstein, Aye; Hesselhuus, Aye; Newton, Aye.

Nays: None.

Carried.

The Clerk then presented the following

RESOLUTION.

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE INCORPORATED TOWN OF CONRAD, GRUNDY COUNTY, IOWA:

"That we do hereby designate the following named bank to be the depository of the town funds in amounts not to exceed the amount named opposite said designated depository and the Town Treasurer is hereby authorized to deposit the town funds in amounts not to exceed in the aggregate the amount named for said bank as follows, to-wit:

First State Bank, Conrad, Iowa, Maximum
Deposit,
\$10,000.00

Moved by Brockway and seconded by Gravenstein that the foregoing resolution be adopted. On the roll being called the following vote resulted: Brockway, Aye; Gravenstein, Aye; Hesselhuus, Aye; and Newton, Aye.

The Council met in regular session at the Town Hall, with Mayor Gier and Councilmen Brockway, Gravenstein, Hesselhuus, and Newton present. Absent: Councilman Crouse.
