Beeghly suggested that the Maintenance Committee decide how to dispose of the city's old sweeper and old blade. Zern and Moler were appointed to do this.

Motion by Lutes and second by Zern, that Mayor Schleisman be authorized to sign the agreement with the DOT, concerning the detour through Conrad next summer. Carried.

The oath of office of clerk was administered to Carol Whipple by Mayor Schleisman.

Dr. Roger Allan, Conrad dentist, presented facts and statistics in regard to tooth decay in children. After this, Dr. Bill Bauer from the State Department of Health, explained a program of flouridation of water that could be implemented in Conrad. He stated that there is a state grant program available. The grant would take care of the full initial cost*the maintenance the first year. There are no funds available at present but there will be by October 1981. The council stated that they would be interested in the program and asked that forms be sent to apply for the grant program.

Engie Wilhite, representing Blue Cross-Blue Shield was present to review the benefits of that insurance company and answer any questions of the council & city employees.

Phyllis Pies and Charlotte Rowilson representing the Entre Nous Club of Conrad stated that in the past their club has purchased street signs and they felt that there were many in town that needed maintenance and some that needed to be put back in place. The council and Chuck Frier stated that they knew this was true and as soon as weather permitted this would be taken care of.

Frank Scott of the Fred Carlson Co., visited with the council about street work. He answered questions regarding the products that his company uses and their equipment. He stated that when Conrad was ready to proceed with any street work that they would consider Fred Carlson Co.

Steve Sawyer of Corning Labs presented the February status report on Conrad's water and sewer facilities. He reported work completed on pump house #4 and as much work completed on pumphouse #3 as weather permitted. Also, that someone from Corning will work on the clair-gester after the sludge line thaws. Sawyer reported that Conrad will need to present a sludge analysis plan to the DEQ. Corning will prepare a plan to be presented at the next regular meeting in April. Sawyer stated that Corning would like their monthly status report entered in the minutes of each council meeting whether a representative is present or not.

Craig Vinton will check with Green Products to see if it is possible to rent a 3200~~0~~ gallon applicator to haul sludge.

The council discussed stop signs at the intersection of Main & Lillian and the pool area. Both permanent signs and roll away signs were discussed. It was agreed to table this discussion until the next meeting.

The name of Rilla Fox was submitted to fill the vacancy left by the resignation of Thelma Johnston on the Board of Adjustment. She agreed to let the council know of her decision by the next regular council meeting.

Lutes and Beeghly met with Bob Kruse and Chuck Frier prior to this council meeting to determine what their wishes were in regard to insurance programs and payment of insurance. Kruse & Frier decided to continue with the Blue-Cross-Blue Shield plan.

Motion by Moler, second by Beeghly to lower the salary of Kruse & Frier by \$600.00 annually and in turn the city will pay the total monthly insurance premiums to Blue Cross-Blue Shield. Carried.

Salary changes outlined in the December 19, 1979 minutes are changed to read as follows: Bob Kruse, \$400.00^{annual} increase retroactive Jan. 1, 1980 for a total annual salary of \$14050.00. Chuck Frier, a \$900.00 annual increase beginning March 11, 1980 for a total annual salary of \$11,900.00.

Mayor Schleisman stated that there was no fire hose on the small red fire truck and authorized the fire department to order a new hose to be left on that truck so it is ready to go at any time.

The fire department was also authorized to hook up one light fixture to the existing box that operates the mercury bulbs on the outside of the building. This would serve as a night light inside the fire station.

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SPECIAL MEETING
MARCH 20, 1980

A special meeting was called to order by Mayor Schleisman in the Council Chambers at 7:30 P.M., for the purpose of coordinating what the council thinks the Fire Department needs in regard to the red fire truck.

Councilmen present: Zern, Moler, Lutes, Graham & Beeghly.
Absent: None

Others present: Steve Metge, Bill Gearhart, Hershel Carnes, John McNair, Bill Hartwig & Warren King.

Mayor Schleisman stated he discovered that the red fire truck had been stripped and although he knew it was used mainly to pump he felt it should be equipped for a fire. He suggested that the old hose be put back on the red truck and if necessary new hose be purchased for the new truck.

Gearhart stated that 600 ft. of 2½ inch hose would cost \$1080.00 or \$1.80 a foot.

After much discussion, it was decided to keep the surplus old hose and a nozzle on the red truck and to keep the truck serviced so that it will start. Also that Gearhart would investigate and report at the next regular council meeting April 14, 1980 exactly how much hose is needed, and what size and the cost of the same.
