Council meet at the City Hall.

Present at roll call: Mayor Chas. Clark, Councilmen R. E. Newton, Ray Gravenstein, E. J. Brockway and J. L. Hesselhuus and Clerk Dewey Larson. Absent Calvin Crouse he being out of the City.

Meeting called to order by Mayor Clark and the Minutes of the meetings held June 2nd and June 8th were read and approved as read.

Treasurers report for June was presented, read and approved as read.

R. E. Newton having objected to the amount of his six (6) months water bill, on motion of Councilman Gravenstein seconded by Councilman Hesselhuus, the amount of \$25.00 was deducted from the bill making the net bill now \$75.67 for the 6 months. No objections appearing to this motion it was declared carried.

The matter of our tax budget being brought up, on motion of R. E. Newton seconded by Ray Gravenstein, it was decided to make the budget \$2,500.00 for the General or Consolidated Fund besides the usual number of mills for the Cemetery and not any Water fund, and that July 27th 1936 be set as the day for hearing of any objections as to these amounts.

There were no objections to this motion so it was declared carried.

The following resolution, prepared by the Central Iowa Telephone Company was then presented, read and passed as read and hereon recorded:

At a Regular meeting of the Town Council of Conrad, Iowa, held at the town hall on on this 13th day of July 1936, at seven o'clock P. M. Councilman R. E. Newton introduced the following RESOLUTION and moved its adoption:

WHEREAS, the town of Conrad has requested the Central Iowa Telephone Company to have its operator upon receipt of a police or fire report put into operation the proper signal by means of signal apparatus placed within the reach of the operator on duty; and

WHEREAS, the Central Iowa Telephone Company has agreed to furnish the above described service without receiving any consideration therefor and only upon condition that it shall assume no liability to the town of Conrad, Iowa, or to third persons in performing said service:

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Mayor and Town Council of the town of Conrad, Iowa,

1. That the Central Iowa Telephone Company's operator act as the agent of said town in the performance of said service and not as the servant of the company.

2. That the Central Iowa Telephone Company assumes no duty of performance whatsoever to said town or to any third person in connection with the performance of such service or in the installation or maintenance of the apparatus used in performing said service.

Seconded by Councilman J. L. Hesselhuus.


The next order of business was the purchase of a Chassis to be used as a fire truck. No bids or draws was to be allowed or considered under this Council.

Chasses was then purchased of Newton Chevrolet Co off Conrad the consideration being the full list price.

Council meet in Special Session at the City Hall


There was present on being called to order:

It was stated the purpose of this meeting was to listen to objections, if any were made, as to the Budget Estimate filed with the board.

After two hours of waiting and no one appearing to make any objection to the filed budget, the matter of town protection during the celebration being put on in Conrad by the Commercial Club, Aug 7, and 8th, this year, was brought up.

On motion of Calvin Crouse seconded by Ray Gravenstein it was decided to hire two Police their time to begin at noon the first day (central time) and that they be paid .35¢ an hour each.

On motion the council adjourned, harmony prevailing.
