At Mayor Beeghly's request Bob Kruse reported on the price of a telephone line from his home to the sheriff's department in Grundy Center. The line would cost \$414. to install and \$111. a month. The council felt this a prohibitive cost.

John McNair was accepted as the new fire chief in a motion by Zern and second by Lutes. Carried.

Bill Gearhart reported that the fire department needs to replace an air mask after the first of the year. He stated that the old mask can be used at the swimming pool. A new mask will cost approximately \$450. and Gearhart was given the councils okay to order one.

Chuck Frier stated that the Fire Department will be attending CPR classes in January. A maximum of 20 men will attend at the cost of \$12. each and the FD would like the city to pay the expense. This was okayed by the council.

Frier also reported that Ritchie Industries would like to use the Fire Departments meeting room for union negotiations. There were no objections by the council.

Lutes stated that he would like to see the city start a personel file on each employee with job description, wages, insurance, etc.

Motion by Lutes, second by King that the above bills be accepted and warrants drawn on the same. Carried.

Don Kleis, Of Prarie Road Builders in Hazelton, was present to introduce himself. He stated his company's speciality has been the sealcoat business since 1970. He quoted the following prices: sealcoat - .85 per sq. yd., Concrete - \$18. to \$22. sq. yd. plus engineering, patching material - \$70. a ton furnished and in place. He stated they would be working in this neighborhood the middle of June.

Pat Whitmire presented a petition to the council asking that the alley along the back of businesses on the west side of Main Street be barricaded midway to prevent the great flow of traffic there. She stated that it was a danger to the children living on the alley. Jerry Johnston stated that the citizens living along the alley wish to preserve the privacy of their back yards. Alan Schiebel stressed the fact that someday someone will make a driving error and a child will be hurt. Mayor Daggett asked for the councils feeling on this. Gearhart stated he was in favor of temporarily closing the alley to reeducate people to use the south and west exits. Lutes felt it would create a real problem by preventing access to the alley. King wanted to look into the problem further. There was a motion by Gearhart and second by Lutes to table this matter until the next regular meeting.

There was a motion by Gearhart that the jail cell used for Conrad's centennial be sold if an interested party is found. Second by Lutes. Carried.

Gearhart was appointed to invite a representative of INRCOG to meet with the new mayor and council to review their services.

There was a motion by King that the Conrad Record be recognized as the official city newspaper for all legal publications for 1982. Second by Gearhart. Carried.

Clapsaddle-Garber Associates are to be retained as the city engineers on an "as needed" basis in a motion by Gearhart, and second by Lutes. Carried.

King made a motion to retain Don Kliebenstein as city attorney for 1982. Second by Lutes. Carried.

There was a motion by Lutes to have Don Kliebenstein recodify the city ordinances and the city order twelve of the best quality binders @ \$24.00 each to hold the ordinances. Second by Gearhart. Carried.

Rilla Fox reported on the prices of magnetic signs for the city vehicles and will check on the prices of decals also. She asked if the council was aware that the lights at the entrance of Clemens Estates have been out for some time. The clerk was to check the minutes to see if this was the responsibility of Clemens or the city. Gearhart is to contact IE and check on a street light between Oakwood Dr. and Duesenberg Dr.

Gearhart stated that he thought Frier should be authorized to obtain extra help when needed without checking with a council member each time. The council agreed to this.

Mayor Daggett appointed a personnel committee of Zern, King and Gearhart to meet with city employees and negotiate wages.

The council members present agreed it best to pursue filing suit against the party living in the mobile home on private property. However, this was tabled until the February meeting as two councilmembers and the attorney were absent.
