

Mayor Gearhart reported he had talked to Wanda Button of the Library Board and will visit with Jim Molloy of the Park Board to ask them to post their agenda for their meetings on the bulletin board at the City Hall 24 hours before a meeting so they will be in compliance with the Open Meetings Law.

Mary Danielson presented her concern about the traffic exceeding the speed limit on North Main Street and was concerned it would be more of a problem this summer when Highway 14 detours through Conrad. Police Chief Bob Kruse assured her the problem would be taken care of.

Dave Fox, speaking as a citizen, was concerned that the cities and people of Grundy County are going to be putting money into the Grundy County Landfill for no good reason. It is his opinion that the landfill should have been closed years ago. There is not enough garbage in Grundy to warrant building a transfer station and purchasing a scale. It is his opinion that Conrad should haul garbage to the Marshall County Landfill and continue to pay a levy to Grundy County for the continuing expenses there.

The clerk was asked to invite Bernard Eilderts and any other Landfill Commission members to come to the April council meeting to answer questions and discuss the situation.

Arrangements have been made with Rick Penning, Grundy County Sheriff, for Dave Colin to work weekends as a reservist until he can be qualified with a pistol.

Sanderson will check with a firm from Wyoming, IA and get some prices in regard to street repair for the next council meeting.

The Brockway property was again discussed, and it was agreed that nothing could be done at the present time because it isn't considered a nuisance or a health hazard.

Motion to adjourn by Sanderson, second by Lutes. Carried.
