Council met in a Special session at the Town Hall: On being called to order by Mayor Belz at 7:00 P. M. the following were present: Berry, Brockway, Clinite, Gravenstein, Larson.

Councilman Gravenstein introduced the following resolution and moved its adoption. Same was seconded by Brockway.

RESOLUTION.

"BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE INCORPORATED TOWN OF CONRAD, GRUNDY COUNTY IOWA:

That the proposed assessments for oiling Washington Street from Center Street to Mayor Belz' north lot line (2 blocks plus); Main from one-half block north of Lillian Avenue south to the C. & N. S. Ry. tracks (5½ blocks); Church Street from Center Street to Lillian Avenue (3 blocks); Center Street from one-half block east of Dwight Street to Main Street (3½ blocks); Grundy Avenue from Washington Street to Alice Street (5 blocks); Maple Avenue from Washington Street to Church Street (2 blocks); and Dwight Street from Grundy Avenue to Center Street (1 block), or 22 blocks in all, which has been prepared by the Clerk and is now on file in his office, notices of which in compliance with the State Law, will be given all persons liable for such cost, be and the same is hereby levied against the property in accordance with the passage of this Resolution, and all such assessments not paid within thirty days after the passage of this Resolution will be certified by the Clerk to the County Auditor as a special tax against the property."

On call of roll, all Councilmen voted Aye.

Mayor Belz declared the Resolution adopted unanimously.
