There was present, Mayor R. C. Shoup, Councilmen J. F. Wheeler, F. J. Dostal, Ray Gravenstein, Calvin Crouse and Clerk D. M. Larson.

On motion of F. J. Dostal seconded by Calvin Crouse the bills were allowed and the Clerk instructed to issue a warrant at this time to Snyder Electric Co., for \$1,190.00 leaving a balance due them of \$5.46 which is to be paid them on completion of their contract, namely, painting the electrolier posts in a workmanlike manner, the paint to be furnished by the city. The firms bond to be held 30 days or until the painting is done.

Mr Snyder was given a unanimous vote of thanks by the council for the courteous and good will he has shown in the fulfillment of his contract which has been done with promptness and in a workman like manner.

Councilman Wheeler absent but came in later in the day.



On motion of Councilman Dostal seconded by Councilman Gravenstein the actual valuation of the Dale Canon property was reduced to \$2,960.00.

On motion of J.F.Wheeler seconded by Calvin Crouse the actual valuation of the Jos Schultz property was reduced to \$1,550.00.

On motion of F. J. Dostal seconded by Ray Gravenstein the books of the assessor were then accepted as corrected.

The Annual Report of Treasurer E. L. Guild was presented, read and on motion of J. F. Wheeler seconded by Calvin Crouse approved and placed on file.

Motion was passed that E. L. Guild be paid \$10.00 for 1935 services.

On motion the old council adjourned after short talks were made by Mayor Shoup and other members of the council appreciating the work of the council men who are leaving the body at this time and expressing the hope that some time in the future they could all have the pleasure of working to-gather again for the good of the community or in some other similar work.

Mayor Shoup, having filed his bond and taken the oath of office as Mayor for another term called the meeting to order. All members of the old council, who were Calvin Crouse, Ray Gravenstein, and R. E. Newton and the new members elected besides these three, H. L. Hesselhuus and Ed J. Brockway then stood while taking the oath of office as administered by Mayor Shoup.

Mayor then called the meeting to order.

On motion of J. L. Hesselhuus seconded by Calvin Crouse D. M. Larson was then elected Clerk of the Town. His bond being presented and the oath of office having been taken he at once assumed the duties of that office.

The matter of the bonds required by the ordinances of the town was then taken up and on motion of Calvin Crouse seconded by Ray Gravenstein it was decided that when the bonds are furnished by a responsible bonding company that the expense of the bonds be paid by the town. This matter, referring to the bonds of Mayor, Clerk, Treasurer, Marshal and Night Watch, Water works Superintendent and Street Commissioner.

The bonds of these officers now costing as follows: Mayor \$5.00, Clerk \$5.00, Treasurer \$10.00 per thousand, his bond being for \$4,000.00 making his bond \$40.00, Marshall \$10.00, Street Commr \$5.00.

In the town election Dewey Hunt having received the largest vote was declared elected but he refused to qualify. Motion was then made by Calvin Crouse seconded by E. J. Brockway that E. L. Guild the former Treasurer be appointed Treasurer. The motion carried and motion made by J. L. Hesselhuus and seconded by R. E. Newton then prevailed that E. L. Guild be paid \$15.00 per year for the coming year, for his service as Town Treasurer.

I. A. Cohens appointment as Fire Chief and Leonard Loverns appointment as Assistant Fire Chief were approved by the council.

On motion of J. L. Hesselhuus Seconded by Ray Gravenstein the Clerk was requested to write the Central States Electric Co., in regard to placing of three lights on our streets.

Mayor Shoop then appointed E. J. Brockway Weed Commissioner.

Clem Van Sickle was then appointed Marshal and Night Watch the salary to be the same as last year I.E. \$40.00 per month.

Robie C. Dickover was appointed Street Commissioner and Supt. of Water Works salary to be the same as paid 1st year and Dr Robert T. Spain appointed Health Officer.

It was decided that requisitions for buying supplies for the City of Conrad be filed with the Clerk. Following resolution was then introduced and on motion, properly made and seconded was carried with no dissenting votes:

Be it resolved by the Council of the Town of Conrad, Iowa that the First State Bank of Conrad, Iowa shall be the depository of all town funds. The Town Treasurer is hereby instructed to deposit all town funds in said bank as soon as received by him and that no funds be paid out except on Orders issued by the Town Clerk.

Dr R. T. Spain was appointed Health Officer for the ensuing year.

Communication from the Central States Electric Co as to present rates was then introduced and the Clerk instructed to make them a part of the minutes of this meeting:

RESIDENCE: (R-133)

The first 30 KWH used per month @ 8.5¢ per KWH.
 The next 30 KWH used per month @ 6.0¢ per KWH.
 The next 30 KWH used per month @ 4.0¢ per KWH.
 All in excess of 90 KWH used per month @ 3¢ per KWH.
 Minimum Monthly Bill \$1.00

COMMERCIAL AND/OR POWER: (C-32)

The first 50 KWH used per mo. @ 8.5¢ per KWH.
 The next 50 KWH used per month @ 6.0¢ per KWH.
 The next 50 KWH used per month @ 5.0¢ per KWH.
 All in excess of 150 KWH used per month @ 3.8¢ per KWH.
 Minimum Monthly Bill for lighting \$1.00.
 Minimum Monthly Bill for lighting and power combined \$1.00 plus 50¢ per horsepower of connected power load.
 Minimum Monthly Bill for power only, 50¢ per horsepower but not less than \$1.00.

All of the above rates and charges are net and the net bills shall be due and payable ten days after rendition. On all bills not paid within ten days after rendition the net amount shall be increased 10% on the first ten dollars and 2% on the balance and the gross bill so determined shall be due and payable.

(The above rates are available in towns of Conrad, Hubbard, Kanawha, Klemme, Radcliff, Wellsburg, Wesley and Williams and became effective in April 1, bills)
