Dear Mr. Simms:

In the mayor-council form of municipal government, the state laws prescribe the salaries that may be paid to city and town councilmen. Councilmen serving in towns with a population of less than 1,000 are eligible to receive \$3 for each meeting attended and in the aggregate not to exceed \$125 per annum.

All other salaries including those to the mayor, clerk, treasurer, and all other municipal employees are established by the council. Your council, therefore, is authorized by authority to set the salaries of these various officials taking in consideration their responsibilities and duties and the amount of time put in on their work, and also taking into consideration the capacity of the town to pay the salary or wages set. There is no uniformity whatsoever over the state with reference to salaries paid to municipal officials and municipal employees. Some towns pay real good salaries, some pay medium salaries, and others pay very poor salaries.
