RESOLUTION ORDERING CONSTRUCTION OF IMPROVEMENT AND DIRECTING ADVERTISEMENT FOR BIDS THEREFOR.

Be it resolved by the town council of the incorporated Town of Conrad, Iowa, that pursuant to a resolution of Necessity, proposed at a meeting of this council on the 19th day of June 1923 and duly passed by this council at a meeting held on the 23rd day of July 1923. it is hereby orderd, upon motion of this council, with out petition of property owners, that the improvement described in said resolution of necessity, consisting of an 8-inch sewer commehcing at the intersection of Alice and Center Streets in said town and running thence east along the center line of said Center Street approximately 370 ft, to the center line of Lincoln Street, thence north on the center line of Lincoln Street approximately 430 ft, to the center line of Grundy Avenue, be and the same are hereby orderd constructed.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Town Clerk be and he is hereby orderd and instructed to advertize for proposals for the construction of the improvements above described, the said improvements to be c constructed in strict accordance with the plans and specifications therefor and approved by the Iowa Board of Health, June 14th 1923 and approved by this Council on the ~~19th~~ 19th day of June 1923; the work to be commenced on or before the first day of Sept, 1923; and to be fully completed on or before the first day of Oct, 1923; That so much of the cost and expenses of said improvement as is by Law assessable aganst* the property abutting upon or adjacent to said improvement will be assessed, and payment will be made to the contractor to the amount of said assessmant out of a fund to be created by the sale of special assessment certificates, bearing interest at the rate of 5% per annum to be issued in accordance with the provisions of the Code of Iowa and all acts amendatory there to, and in anticipation of the collection of said special assessments#; any deficiency between the amount of the contract price and the amount of said special assessment certificates will be paid in warrants drawn on the General Fund of said town available for the year 1923,
 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that proposals received for the construction of said improvement will be opened by this council at a meeting to be held in the council chamber in said Town on the 6th day of August 1923. at 8 O, Clock P M, and acted upon at said time, or such later time as may be then fixed.
 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Town Clerk of said town be and he is hereby orderd and directed to advertize for bids for the making of such Improvement to be received at the time and place here in before specified and that each bid must be accompanied, in a separate envelope, with a certified check payable to the Treasurer of said town, in the sum of 5 per cent of the amount of his bid, as security thwt the bidder will enter into a concontract with said town for the doing of such work, and will furnish bonds for the faithful performance of his concontract, in the amount of 100% of contract price, which bond will also include a provision requiring the contractor and his bondsman to keep said improvement in good repair for a period of 5 years, from and after the completion and acceptance thereof.
